Message to Parents about Prevention

Never assume that just because you know where your child is & who they are with, that this could not happen to them.

Unfortunately, Child Sexual Abuse <u>can</u> happen Anywhere, Anytime, to Any Child Please understand that 95% of Children who are Molested/Raped/Exploited know the person abusing them & in many cases, loves & trusts this person.

Never assume that if this happens or is happening to your child that they will tell you.

Sexual Predators know how to silence children.

And as a Parent, your understanding of this horrific crime is imperative for your child's safety.

What Can <u>YOU</u> Do? (Parents/Grandparents)

You can take preventive steps to lessen the likelihood that your Child will ever be faced with such a violation as is involved when a Child is Sexually Abused.

More on Prevention for Parents

Learn All That You Can...

- ⇒ Get Educated on the crime of Child Sexual Abuse
- Continue Education & Keep up to date
- ⇒ Familiarity with the Internet & Cell Phones (what teens & child predators are doing)



Talk To Your Child...

- \Rightarrow We talk to our children about many other things... importance of education, dangers of drugs & alcohol, no one should ever touch their private parts, don't talk to strangers, etc...
- By not talking to children about Child Sexual Abuse, Parents may be unknowingly enabling their children to be "easy prey".
- You cannot protect your child from this crime without talking to them specifically about Incest, Molestation, Rape & Exploitation; at the age-appropriate level.
- Children need to know the dangers out there.
- They need to know that if this happens or is happening to them that they can come to you.
- They need to know that no matter who may be doing this to them, that you will believe them.
- Children need to feel Safe to Tell on their Abuser
- ⇒ Explain to your child that although they are to respect adults/authority, there are exceptions to that rule.

Factors to Consider when Talking to Your Child

- Age of Child (i.e. Safe/Unsafe or Appropriate/Inappropriate Touch)
- Maturity of Child
- Personality of Child
- Parents Know their Child better than Anyone; in most cases
- There must be Communication between Parents & Childcare Providers & Teachers
- **Utilize Available Resources**
- Seek Professional Help, if needed, prior to talking to your child
- Talk About in Small Bits; But Often (Repetition = Retention)
- Start with the Swim Suit Area, but Don't Stop There



OVERALL GOAL

Open Up the Communication Line between you and your Child or Grandchild; Not to Install Fear

- ⇒ Online Resources Sex Offender Registries National & Statewide Searches Family Watch Dog U.S. Department of Justice
- ⇒ Check with local Authorities on information they have available as well By City
- ⇒ Ask for References & Follow Through
- ⇒ Background Checks Online For a fee

Inquire About Safety Precautions Taken by Others...

- ⇒ Schools, Churches, Daycare Providers, Other Groups/Activities
- ⇒ Background Checks
- \Rightarrow Sex Offender Registries
- ⇒ Don't Be Shy; its your Child's Safety we're talking about.

Know & Remember the Statistics; primarily...

95% of Children who are Sexually Abused know their Abuser and possibly Love and Trust that person.

Tell Others...

The more Parents who are aware of the reality & possibility of Child Sexual Abuse, and the more Children who know the dangers, the Safer our Children will be... All Children.

It's time we send a message to those who prey on Innocent Children by... SpeakingOut against Child Sexual Abuse!
